About Us

Art from the Margins (AFTM) is a creative initiative of Wesley Mission Queensland and has been instrumental in bringing artists together and bridging the gap between artists living in isolation and the wider community since 2008. AFTM supports and promotes the work of artists living with adversity, including artists living with mental health issues, physical or intellectual disabilities, or experiencing homelessness and social isolation. AFTM currently provides exhibition and professional development opportunities for artists living in the greater Brisbane region and wider Queensland community. It is intended to extend the AFTM reach nationally.

Message from the AFTM Chair

Art from the Margins (AFTM) held its first exhibition in 2008. The seed for AFTM was planted by a person living an isolated life. He understood homelessness. He described the curse of boredom for a homeless person. With no structure to frame ones activities, the day for a homeless person can be very long indeed. Like everyone else, the person living in isolation requires activities to avoid a sense of hopelessness. Engagement with art is one way such a person can obtain a sense of fulfilment. There are a number of organisations which offer art programs which are popular for people living lonely lives. AFTM complements these programs by offering exhibition space for these artists.

When AFTM held its first exhibition in 2008, it became apparent that for artists living with profound adversity, this was a richly fulfilling experience. There is no doubt that the exhibition was an enriching time for people who had received very little recognition in their lives. This was not a one-off. AFTM observes this repeatedly.

AFTM was initially a service for people living with homelessness. Early on, it became apparent that people at risk of homelessness should also be beneficiaries of our program. AFTM expanded the criteria for acceptance into its exhibitions to include physical and intellectual impairment and mental illness. It also holds exhibitions celebrating artists from the Indigenous and refugee communities.

Opportunities abound for AFTM to continue to make a difference to the lives of people living with disadvantage. AFTM has been privileged to be supported by talented staff and volunteers. Without their support AFTM would not be effective in fulfilling its Mission. In addition, it is essential that AFTM has a clear understanding of its goals and direction. This Strategic Plan is an essential tool for ensuring the program remains focused.

The 2019 – 2022 Strategic Plan builds on its predecessor – each year the social environment changes. It is important that the Strategic Plan is relevant to the times. In addition, it is appropriate that AFTM takes advantage of new opportunities and reflects on how it can build on its successes – hence the need for regular renewal.

I thank the AFTM Board, staff and volunteers who have contributed to the development of the 2019 – 2022 Strategic Plan. I also thank Pricewaterhouse Coopers and in particular Osman Liaquat and Natalia Khamenskaia for their skilful facilitation of the process. This was an amazing donation to the life of AFTM.
